










NPS Emergence (2008-2013)












Synthetic cannabinoids Phenethylamines Cathinones Tryptamines Others Plant-based substances Piperazines Phencyclidine type substances Aminoindanes Unverified



- Most obvious increase is in number of synthetic cannabinoids
- 60 Substances reported from 2009-mid 2012
- 51 new substances reported from 2012-2013
- Example of evolution: MAM-2201 (1st reported in 2011)

Modifications to the 5-fluoropentyl alkyl chain, have produced 4-fluoropentyl, 3-flouropentyl, 2-fluoropentyl, 4-hydroxypentyl derivatives



The same fluoro derivatives have appeared for XLR-11 and including 4-pentenyl modification

Modifications to two existing substances has produced 8 new variants
